This introduction to Scrotal Castration surgical training lab will cover the basic techniques of scrotal castration of canines including: clipping and rough prep, surgical prep, scrotal incision approach, intraoperative closed technique for ligation of spermatic cords and closure of surgical site.

It is recommended that attendees have prior surgical experience for this lab. Surgery will be “hands on” with a live patient and guided by a scrubbed in Shelter Medicine Clinician.

Participants will be required to attend the lecture at 8 AM on Friday June 16th, before coming to lab. **Please wear surgical scrub suit to lab.** Adoption of this technique will lead to refinement of surgical skills and reduction of time required to neuter a canine compared to a “traditional prescrotal approach.”
